I was not informed that we were not hooked up to city sewer. I was told when garbage was picked up every week and that I would be receiving a bill every month for \$80.00 which was for my garbage, water and sewer.

In December of 2018 my husband called the City of Long Beach to come look at the sewer lines because we were having problems with the plumbing. At that time, we were informed that the city lines were not clogged and that we needed to call a plumber, which we did and that is when we were told that we were not on city sewer that we had a septic tank buried somewhere in the back yard and that it need to be emptied.


