Due to the recent loss in water pressure, the City of Long Beach, MS has issued a precautionary boil water notice until further notice for the following area:

Greenwood Avenue

TOTAL NUMBER OF CONNECTIONS AFFECTED: 27

(If your address is not included in this area, you are not affected.)

This precautionary action is necessary because the system lost pressure. When a water distribution system loses pressure, contaminants can siphon back into the system. Public Health officials consider any system that has lost pressure contaminated until tests of the water prove otherwise. This notice does not mean that your water is unsafe, but it does mean that you must take precaution and boil your consumable water before use. All customers in affected area are advised to boil their drinking water until notice is lifted. As soon as pressure is restored, water system officials will begin collecting samples for testing. Customers in affected area will be notified when the boil water notice is lifted. If you have questions, please contact City of Long Beach Public Works Department at (228) 863-0440.

Water should be brought to a rolling boil for one minute for the following:

- Drinking
- Cooking or baking
- Making ice cubes
- Taking medication
- Brushing teeth
- Washing food
- Mixing baby formula or food
- Mixing juices or drinks
- Feeding pets
- Washing dishes
- All other water consumption
