CITY OF LONG BEACH ISSUES PRECAUTIONARY BOIL WATER NOTICE FOR PARK ROW AVENUE

Long Beach, MS, April 10, 2026– The City of Long Beach Water System has issued a precautionary boil water notice for residents along Park Row Avenue due to a planned project that will temporarily impact water system pressure. During the course of this project, a temporary loss of pressure in the water distribution system may occur. When pressure drops, there is a possibility that contaminants could enter the system through back-siphonage. In accordance with guidelines from the Mississippi State Department of Health, a boil water notice is required anytime system pressure is lost until testing confirms the water is safe for consumption.

Only customers located within the affected area of Park Row Avenue are impacted. Residents outside of this area are not affected by this notice. As a precaution, all customers in the affected area are advised to bring water to a rolling boil for at least one (1) minute before using it for:

- Drinking
- Cooking or baking
- Making ice
- Brushing teeth
- Washing food
- Preparing baby formula
- Taking medication
- Washing dishes
- Feeding pets
- Any other consumption-related use

This notice does not necessarily mean the water is unsafe; however, these steps are recommended until the advisory is lifted. Once the project is complete and normal system pressure is restored, water samples will be collected and submitted for laboratory testing. The boil water notice will remain in effect until test results confirm the water is safe. Residents will be notified when the notice has been lifted.
