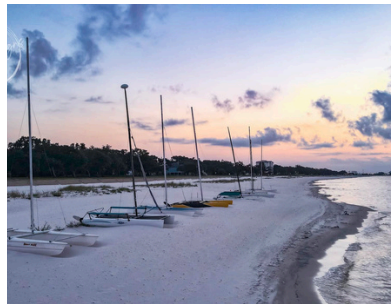
Sweet Summertime in Long Beach

Is my water safe?

Last year, your tap water met all U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and state drinking water health standards. We are proud to report that our system did not violate a maximum contaminant level or any other water quality standard during the past year.

Do I need to take special precautions?

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised individuals such as those undergoing cancer treatment, organ transplant recipients, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune disorders, the elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk. Where does my water come from?

Your drinking water comes from 10 deep water wells located throughout the City of Long Beach. Three wells draw from the Graham Ferry Formation, while the remaining seven draw from the Pascagoula Formation.

Finally First Friday – July 3 | 7 PM

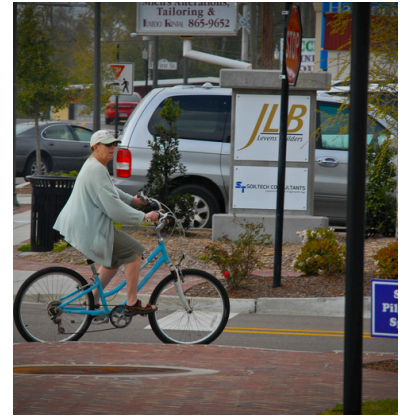
